SOME IMPORTANT SCHOLARS

Dr. Helen Rodriguez Trías (Puerto Rican): became the first Latina president of the American Health Association in 1993, founded the first center for newborns in Puerto Rico, and was pivotal in the AIDS/HIV epidemic

Nichole Hernandez Hammer (Guatemalan): Researcher and biologist who studies the effects of climate change on sea levels and vulnerable populations on the coastal areas of the United States. She speaks extensively on climate change impact and has authored several papers in The Washington Post and The New York Times!

Mario Molina (Mexican): Won a noble prize and Presidential Medal of Freedom for his research on how man-made compounds can affect the ozone layer!
